



Bus

Dublin Bus Services

Good Friday and Easter Saturday

In order to facilitate the building of viewing stands, O'Connell Street will be closed to traffic. Dublin Bus services which normally operate via O'Connell Street will operate via Parnell Street – Gardiner Street – South Quays/Eden Quay and return to their normal routing at D'Olier Street/Westmoreland Street.

Easter Sunday

Due to the Easter Sunday Commemoration Parade there will be a large number of street closures in Dublin City Centre. A number of Dublin Bus services will operate from 10 temporary termini located around the city centre. These are shown on the map overleaf, with the T1 to T10 symbols. Buses stopping at each terminus are listed in the indices. A number of routes will continue to operate cross city throughout the day and are shown with a blue line on the map.

Easter Monday

A number of commemorative events will take place on Easter Monday. As a result O'Connell Street will remain closed and buses will be diverted via Parnell Street - Gardiner Street - South Quays/Eden Quay and return to their normal routing at D'Olier Street/Westmoreland Street.

On Easter Sunday and Easter Monday Dublin Bus will operate an enhanced service which will provide additional capacity for people travelling to and from the commemorative events. Bus Éireann Services

Due to the closure of O'Connell Street, Routes 103, 105, 109 and 111 will operate via Gardiner Street enroute to Dublin City Centre from 11:00pm Thursday evening until first service on Tuesday morning.

Easter Sunday

Bus Éireann has a significantly enhanced timetable in operation for Easter Sunday. Due to extensive road closures a number of Bus Éireann services have been re-routed while a small number of termini have been relocated for the day.

All Expressway inter-city services will depart from Busáras at their scheduled time, operating via the Dublin Port Tunnel to the M50. Commuter services will operate to and depart from the following locations:

- Routes 103 and 105 – **Beresford Place**
- Routes 100X and 120 – **Custom House Quay**
- Route 101 – **Talbot Street**
- Routes 109 and 111 – **Busáras**
- Route 115 – **Amiens Street**
- Routes 126 and 133 – **George's Quay**

Bus Éireann Services - continued

Easter Monday

In order to cater for additional customer demand Bus Éireann will operate a Saturday timetable on Easter Monday on the following routes:

All other routes will operate per schedule on Easter Monday. However, we regret that Bus Éireann will be unable to serve stops at **Heuston Station, Ha'penny Bridge** and **Wilton Terrace**.

Private Bus Services

Private operators provide a range of licensed bus services including commuter, airport, inter-city services and tours. Most of these operators pick up and set down passengers at licensed stops around Dublin City. Due to the closure of O'Connell Street from Good Friday to early morning on Tuesday, 29th March 2016, any services usually operating from O'Connell Street will be relocated. Most of the other existing licensed stops should not be affected by road closures on Good Friday, Easter Saturday and Easter Monday. However, please check with your private operator where your bus will pick up and set down passengers on those days.

On **Easter Sunday**, there will be extensive road closures due to the Parade taking place. Some operators are also adding services to cater for additional customer demand.

As part of the Traffic Management Plan, specific areas have been designated for the picking up and setting down of passengers by licensed private operators. They are indicated with the purple bus icon on the map. Generally, services coming from the west of the city (i.e. near Heuston Station) will set down at Wolf Tone Quay on entering the city and pick up at Victoria Quay on exiting the city. Services that operate to Dublin Airport will continue via Church Street.

Set down and pick up areas have been designated in Amiens Street, Cumberland Street North and George's Quay for services from the north or east of the city.

For services coming from the south of the city, an area in Westland Row has been designated for pick up and set down of passengers.

Please check with your private operator where the pick up and set down for your particular bus will be on the day as well as details of the timetable of services that will operate on the day.

Irish Rail Services

Easter Sunday

Dart and Commuter Services: There will be additional Dart and Commuter services provided before and after the Parade to bring spectators to and from the city centre. Additional capacity will also be provided on our regular services throughout the day.

Intercity Services: A regular Sunday service will operate on Intercity routes on Easter Sunday and maximum capacity will be provided on all trains before and after the Parade. The provision of special trains is dependent on expected demand which is being monitored daily through our online reservation system. Where demand arises, we will provide additional services.

Easter Monday

Dart and Commuter Services: A regular weekday service will operate on the Dart network on Easter Monday commencing from about 8.00am with additional capacity being provided where necessary.

A special timetable is being introduced for commuter services which will result in both an increase in capacity and the provision of special trains to cater for the expected demand.

Intercity Services:

Passengers are asked to refer to our published Easter timetable for details on services across our Intercity network, which is available at www.irishrail.ie.

Notes:

Tara Street station will remain closed on Easter Sunday and Easter Monday. Docklands station will remain closed from Friday 25th March to Tuesday 29th March.

Park and Ride facilities are available from the following locations: M3 Parkway, Dunboyne, Maynooth, Leixlip Louisa Bridge, Clonsilla, Coolmine, Navan Road Parkway, Rush & Lusk, Donabate, Malahide, Portmarnock, Clongriffin, Kildare, Newbridge, Sallins & Naas and Hazelhatch & Celbridge.

Luas Services

Easter Sunday

Luas services on the Luas Red and Green Lines will operate an enhanced weekend service to facilitate travel to and from the Parade.

The Luas Red Line will operate from Tallaght/Saggart to Smithfield and a shuttle service will operate between The Point and Abbey Street between 9am and 5pm. Connolly stop will be closed for the day.

The Luas Green Line will operate from Brides Glen/Sandyford to Harcourt Street inbound and from St. Stephen's Green to Sandyford/Brides Glen outbound.

Full Luas services will be restored when traffic restrictions are lifted.

Easter Monday

An enhanced weekday service will operate on the Luas Red and Green lines.

Taxi

A Garda cordon will be in place around Dublin City Centre on Easter Sunday with many road and taxi rank closures in place. Operating ranks can be seen on the map.

You can download the free **Driver Check App** to verify that the vehicle that you are about to hire has been correctly registered and that the driver has the appropriate licence to operate the vehicle. You can search by car registration number, vehicle licence number or driver licence number. There is also the facility to email a friend with your trip details.
