



Road Closures Traffic Management

Location A:

• Western Way (Dominick Street Upper to Mountjoy Street) from 19.00hrs on Saturday 16th March 2024 to 15.00hrs on Sunday 17th March 2024.

Locations B:

- Mountjoy Street, Mountjoy Street Middle, Palmerstown Place, Wellington Street Lower, Saint Mary's Place
- North, Granby Row, Parnell Square North, Parnell Square East, Cavendish Row, O'Connell Street
- Upper & Lower, O'Connell Bridge from 04.00hrs to 15.00hrs on Sunday 17th March 2024.

Locations C:

• Westmoreland Street, College Green, Dame Street, Lord Edward Street, Christchurch Place, High Street, Nicholas Street, Patrick Street from 04.00hrs to 17.00hrs on Sunday 17th March 2024.

Locations D:

• New Street South, Clanbrassil Street Lower, Kevin Street Upper, Kevin Street Lower from 04.00hrs to 18.00hrs on Sunday 17th March 2024.

Road Closures Traffic Management Continued

Locations E:

• Cuffe Street and Saint Stephens Green South from 04.00hrs to 18.30hrs on Sunday 17th March 2024.

Traffic Management Plan

- Traffic on Ellis Quay travelling north and east will be diverted via Blackhall Place, Stoneybatter, Manor Street, Prussia Street, North Circular Road, Portland Row, Seville Place and Guild Street
- Traffic on North Wall Quay travelling south will be diverted via Moss Street, Townsend Street and Lombard Street.
- Traffic on North Wall Quay travelling west will be diverted via Guild Street, Seville Place, Portland Row, North Circular Rd, Phibsborough Road, Constitution Hill, King Street North and Queen Street.

Pedestrian access will be maintained.

• Custom House Quay (from Beresford Place to Memorial Road) from 19.00hrs on Friday 15th March 2024 to 06.00hrs on Tuesday 19th March 2024.

Traffic Management Plan

- A signed diversion route will be put in place.
- Pedestrian and access will be maintained.

St. Patrick's Festival – St Patrick's Festival Quarter

• Liffey Street West, Benburb Street, Ellis Street, Hendrick Place from 11.00hrs to 23.30hrs on Saturday 16th March 2024 and Sunday 17th March 2024.

Waste Management

- Businesses requested to leave out waste due for collection by private operators by 3am on the 17th March
- Additional DCC waste crews have been rostered from 6am on the 17th until 9am on 18th to ensure that all litter is picked up during and post parade within the City Centre areas
- Waste Management coordinator will be in place in event control in India Base on the 17th March to coordinate the cleansing operation on the 17th March
- All efforts will be made to ensure the City Centre area is cleaned and presentable on the morning of the 18th March at the time of opening of businesses

Street Furniture/Safe circulation and capacity

- Require all outdoor street furniture including associated infrastructure and other paraphernalia such as sandwich boards barrels, etc. are removed by close of business on the 16th March 2024 at latest and not put out again until opening of business on the 18th March 2024.
- This is to facilitate safe capacity and circulation within the City on the 17th March

This is a map of the relevant areas required and has been previously advised and circulated to the businesses concerned

Temple Bar/Environs Safety Plan AGS/DCC

- Temple Bar and Environs Plan will be put in place again this year. Plan is same form and arrangements as last year
- Purpose of plan is to prevent general and localised overcrowding and antisocial issues such as on street drinking and public intoxication
- 45 controlled access points, Garda and specialised steward at each access location point
- Bins and crowd control barriers provided from 10am
- Alcohol will be seized at the access points insofar as is practical
- Additional CCTV has been put in place to monitor on street patron numbers in the
 relevant areas of Temple Bar and environs. Closure of various zones/locations will be put in
 place as required should overcrowding occur either localised or general with exit only
 permitted at those times.
- Closures will only remain in place for as long as required from a safety perspective

Important General Safety Management requirements

- All businesses who have a liquor licence to ensure that no alcohol sold on their premises is permitted to leave their premises for consumption on the street
- No overcrowding to be permitted within any business premises on the day that would compromise staff, patron or fire safety
- Food premises, including takeaways to keep the areas within and immediately outside their premises clean and tidy and to avoid giving out additional bags or packaging with food served if possible. Business advertising flyers on the day should also be avoided
- DCC wishes all businesses within the City a safe and profitable weekend for them and all their staff and wish to thank you all for your continued engagement and cooperation associated with this event.
